John J. Bagley was educated at Cowley School, St Helens, and the University of Liverpool. He graduated in 1930 and since then, apart from war-time service in the R.A.F., he has been teaching and studying history. He was first a schoolmaster at Rochdale and Upholland and then a staff tutor and senior staff tutor in the Extra-Mural Department of the University of Liverpool. He considers himself lucky that he had a grounding in the history of Medieval England from three such tutors as G. W. Coopland, May McKisack, and the late R. R. Betts.

John Bagley has published biographies of Margaret of Anjou and Henry VIII, histories of Lancashire and Upholland Grammar School, and a social history, *Life in Medieval England*. Since the war he has developed a particular interest in the history of the north-western counties. He is one of the two honorary editors of the *Transactions of the Historic Society of Lancashire and Cheshire*, general editor of *A History of Cheshire*, and a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.
